Message From Hawaii Massage Clinic's Response to COVID-19

Hawaii Massage Clinic is carefully monitoring all new developments involving the public health risk of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Standard Precaution and basic concepts of infection prevention measures based on the CDC (American Centers for Disease Control) is an essential part of the Lomino Hawaii Massage School curriculum. At our student clinic, Hawaii massage clinic is practicing Standard Precaution as a part of our daily clinical training program. Also, all of our massage room is private (up to 2 customers and 2 therapists at a time) for providing a safe environment to our customer. We put an extra effort into practicing Standard Precaution to protect the health and safety of our clients, students and faculty.

[What we do:]

- Enhance daily alcohol or bleach disinfection cleaning of all the massage rooms, bathrooms, and common areas.
- Thorough cleaning and disinfecting areas and surface, where may be in direct contact with hands (doorknobs, around water dispenser, massage tables, massage face cradle, chairs, etc.)
- Disinfecting massage area and equipment before and after each customer visit.
- Opening outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the reception area before and after each customer visit.
- Opening outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the massage area before and after each massage.
- Linens are stored in a closed container while in any room or during transport and laundered in a manner that eliminates the risk of spreading communicable diseases.
- Frequent hand washing and respiratory etiquette including wearing facemasks when necessary.
- Personal health management.
- Self-restraint is required if any flu-like symptoms are present or any of household members and close contacts are sick.
- Always stay calm and updated on COVID-19.
- Screening of clients before scheduling appointments and advisory to stay home if experiencing any symptoms.
